#### **FACTS Financial Aid Information:**

NEW THIS YEAR! Families who want to apply for financial aid for their students for the 2023-24 school year will only be required to use their 2021 tax returns and not their 2022 tax returns. Returning families will already have the 2021 tax returns on file with FACTS so no new uploads for those documents are needed! W-2s are not needed. (If there is a scenario where a using the 2022 tax return is beneficial to the family, the 2022 tax return can be uploaded once the forms are ready and FACTS will recalculate need.) The financial aid application for 23-24 school year must be completed.

On February 7th, Mrs. Cline's seventh grade Life Science class took part in a blood typing lab with Seton Hill seniors, Allie Sheffler and Sarah Semekoski. Geibel Catholic is thrilled to be part of Seton Hill's Future Scholars Program. The program is sponsored by Assistant Professor of Chemistry, Dr. Amalene Cooper-Morgan, Assistant Professor of Chemistry Dr. Sarah Joiner, and Assistant Professor of Biology, Dr. Donna Haworth-Brown. The program offers STEM lessons to community schools.

Mrs. Cline provided the Seton Hill seniors with topics that are relevant to the course of study in her classes. Working with Mrs. Cline and Seton Hill professors, Allie and Sarah came to Geibel to present their engaging science lessons on Tuesday.

Currently, the seventh graders are learning about the Circulatory System and had a wonderful lab learning about blood typing. They had a fun experiment figuring out the blood type of an accident victim and then determining which of his friends could donate blood to him.

On February 7th, Mrs. Cline's eighth grade Physical Science class took part in a chemistry lesson that ended with a colorful "explosion". The lab was presented by Seton Hill seniors, Allie Sheffler and Sarah Semekoski who are part of Seton Hill's Future Scholars Program. The program was started by Assistant Professor of Chemistry, Dr. Amalene Cooper-Morgan in the Fall of 2021. Geibel Catholic is thrilled to join the program for the Spring of 2023.

During the experiment, the students learned the importance of a catalyst in chemistry and the difference between endothermic and exothermic reactions. They had a great time making an "explosion" and feeling the heat that it generated.

The Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science (PJAS) was founded in 1934 and gives students the opportunity to expand their scientific research and public presentation skills while utilizing the scientific method.

Each participant develops independent research projects that they present to a panel of judges at the regional competition. Judges are industrial scientists, engineers, college professors, and STEM high school teachers.

Students who receive first place awards at their regional meet are eligible to compete against all first-place winners from across the state at Penn State University in May.



Troy Hoffer, Riley Knizner, Khalia Zylka, and Mason Sweeney and their sponsor, Mrs. Cline have been busy preparing for the 2023 Western Pennsylvania Science Bowl Middle School Competition on Saturday, March 4th. They will have questions in the areas of math, earth science, physical science, life science, and energy. Geibel is proud to be one of the schools selected for this competition that is sponsored by the U.S. Department of Energy.

The Program, run through the College's Education Department, part of the School of Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences. is again able to offer all program options this summer.

The Challenge Program is currently offering an early registration incentive

Those who enter the code WINTER BLITZ at checkout will receive a discount off of the normal cost of registration. This discount is available now through Feb. 28.

The theme for the 2023 Challenge Program is "Wizard Col-lege 2023," and interested participants can choose from a variety of Apprentice Wizard overnight program immersions for grades 5-12, high school overnight immersion programs for grades 9-12 and middle school over-

Additionally, younger children can participate in the Fledgling Wizards program for preschool and kindergarten-aged students and Neophyte Wizards day program for grades 1-4.

The Apprentice Wizard programs are scheduled for June 18 through 23, 2023.

The Fledgling day program is offered from June 19 through 23, from 9 a.m.-noon, while the Neophyte Day program is being offered on the same days, from 9 a.m.-4 p.m.

All Apprentice Wizard overnight students are housed in the Rooney Hall residence hall, and on- campus meals are provided to both the day and overnight attendees by Parkhurst Dining

The Apprentice Wizard overnight program, open to students entering grades 5-12, offers the opportunity to choose two immersion experiences to participate in throughout the week: a three- hour morning and a threeculminates with a final project, event or challenge.

Some immersions will be on-campus and others in the local area off-campus. Course instructors will encourage full participation, collaboration and authentic learning while offering project-based experiences to encourage students to deepen their understanding. Evenings will be full of planned fun and entertainment

The Neophyte Wizards program allows students in grades 1-4 the opportunity to participate in academically and creatively theme-based experiences, led by certified elementary teachers. These interactive courses happen in a half-day offering.

During the other half of the day, the children will be involved in an immersion experience, with guest presenters, planned events and group opportunities. A counselor will remain all day with the group of children to help them throughout their expe-

with lunch and a snack each day.

Preschool and kindergarten students are invited to take part in the half-day Fledgling Wizards program (9 a.m. - noon), which will feature multiple learning experiences with magical missions incorporated throughout. Each class is taught by a certified teacher and counselors will be on hand.

Students will participate in activities and lessons both inside and outside and will be provided a snack each day.

All Challenge Program instructors are certified teachers who are either Saint Vincent College alumni or current graduate students. All program counselors are undergraduate majors in the College's Department of Education training to become teachers.

Counselors and instructors undergo thorough training to ensure the enjoyment and safety of the children.

Information regarding the specifics and schedules for the end-of-the-year Senior events will be distributed in a few weeks. In preparation for these events, I am publishing the dress attire expectations, so that students and families can plan accordingly.

#### **Senior Events Attire**

Girls:

- White or cream-colored dress, or skirt/pants and blouse
- Dress/skirt of modest length and modest neckline
- The straps of the tops must be at least one inch wide. Dresses with spaghetti straps should be covered at all times with a sweater or jacket.

Dress shoes or dress sandals with back strap. No flip-flops or athletic shoes. You will be standing and walking in these shoes for some time — make sure that they are sensible and comfortable. Dress shoes should not have a heel greater than 2.5 inches. Choose your shoes carefully!
